**7. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS**

**A. Navajo County Budget Presentation**

Glen Kephart - Power plants closing is a significant loss of money and jobs; worried of the impact of this for everyone and try to figure out our options. Would have to cut on public safety and trim county jobs. Try to increase economy growth and bring in new industries.

Brian Layton – Spoke of the adjustments the County has done over the last year. Spoke of the revenue they will lose and will look at every angle of where to trim costs and what the revenue possibilities are.

**B. Discussion and Possible Approval of IGA w/Navajo County for Financial Assistance for paving Rodeo Rd**

-Brian - Partnership with the county to pave Rodeo Rd

**C. Discussion and Possible Approval of Ordinance No. 2018-01 Title 4, Chapter 6 Industrial Hemp**

- Brian – This regulates where hemp can be grown. Mr. Symington is concerned with the boundaries.

-Fife - Hemp could destroy the quality of the crop we have. We have no male plants to pollinate but with industrial hemp there is no worry for male or female plants. Hemp seeds can spread long distances and would need at least 10 mile radius from the marijuana facility with the winds here.

**D.** Discussion and Possible Approval of 15 Foot Wide Public Non-motorized Trail Revocable License Agreement  
- Brian – Working on some trail systems, property owners have agreed if they are not responsible for anyone that gets hurt, insurance has approved, Bob has approved and Mr. Symington has offered some financial support for it. We will get some volunteer workers to help out.
