3. **PROCLAMATIONS AND RECOGNITIONS**

Chief Martin presented Derick Ortiz as the new Lieutenant and David Young as the new Patrol Sergeant. A. Consideration of Resolution 2019-07 Adopting the Final Budget for the Town of Snowflake for FY 19- 20.

Motion by Lewis B, 2nd by Perkins, to approve Resolution 2019-07 adopting the Final Budget for FY 19-20. Motion passed; unanimous

B. Consideration of Special Use Permit - Kay and Rhonda Solomon

Dale Call presented the issue to council from the Solomon's. Requesting to build an accessory structure on the rear of their property. Planning and Zoning voted to approve the recommendation. This special use permit meets the requirement set forth in the town code.

Johnson C asked for clarification on the quote stating should not be used for a residential structure- Dale says this pertains to future consideration outside of the special use permit. Something the council may want to consider in the future, it is not part of the current code.

Kay and Ronda Solomon- explained the reason behind asking for the special use permit to house Ronda's parents who recently sold their home in Taylor that was too large for them to take care of. They have followed the direction set forth by Planning and Zoning
