Brian presented a line-item change that added \$50,000 to 10-51-47 and took it from the contingency fund 10-85-91. It doesn't change the dollar amount of the budget.

B. ORDINANCE 2024-06: ZONING CHANGE REQUEST: 202-31-005Q (DUNFORD): REZONE FROM AG TO R-2
